PURPOSE & MISSION

The Organization is completely void of any denominational barriers and is dedicated to promoting service in Christian, social, and moral activities as Ushers. In essence, to promote "Church ushering" as a "ministry."

We believe that the mission of the Church is to lead all mankind to Christ and that the Church Usher has a very definite part to play in the accomplishment of the church's mission as God's representatives on earth. So much can be accomplished through organized efforts; thus, we can't see any just reason why all Church Ushers should not be joined together in one great organization working for the betterment of a common cause.

ICUA ORGANIZATION

The ICUA is a religious, tax-exempt Association that depends solely on its annual dues and various fundraising events throughout the year to support itself. The annual dues are appropriated, not necessarily in this order, for the cost of (1) Maintenance, insurance and recurring monthly expenses of the headquarters located at 1923 - 16th Street, NW; (2) Space rentals for Business Meetings and Special Events; (3) Local and National scholarships (4) Eastern Region (ER) and the National United Church Ushers Association of America, Inc. (NUCUAA) Membership Assessments (5) Skill Training Workshops (6) supplement annual charitable donations



MEMBERSHIP

Any Church Usher Organization may become a member of the ICUA by (a) making a written application for membership in the Association (b) agreeing to comply with, and be bound by, the Charter, By-Laws, and other rules and regulations of the Association (c) paying the membership entrance fee and (d) approval of the application by the Board of Trustees of the Association and, ultimately, by the Parent Body itself.


Greeting Ushers,



Dear Fellow Ushers

The ICUA headquarters needs repairs and maintenance. Over the last 18 months several expensive repairs were completed at our headquarters. All these repairs were unscheduled and done on an emergency basis. These repairs included the installation of a sump pump and water proofing of the kitchen. Most recently emergency repairs were done on the roof flashing to prevent leaking into the attached apartment building. These repairs depleted our Building Maintenance Fund and some of the costs were paid for from the operations funding of the parent body. Repairs are still needed in the basement as well as on the stone facade on the rear of the building.

To replenish the building maintenance fund and replace the monies used from the operating account, the Board of Trustees is initiating a pledge campaign to raise the needed funds. (Hybrid Class)

2024 - 2025 BEGINNERS

(First Year of Ushering Class)

Objectives of Course

The Beginners Class will acquaint Ushers with its Biblical background, establishment and purpose in today's Church. Beginners will learn how and when to execute Signs and Signals in Church Services, Sermons, and Special Programs. They will also learn how to serve on a Welcome Committee (Greeters) and how to manage a Time of Fire, disaster or emergency within the Church. This course will touch on how to (1) Collect the Offerings, (2) Serve Communion, (3) Usher for a Funeral, and (4) Perform a Ritualistic Service for a Deceased Usher.

Mandatory in-person floor training is an integral part of the Beginners Class. This will provide Students with actual hands-on floor experience.

2024-2025 POST GRADUATE I

(Second Year of Ushering Class)

CRITERIA:

Students must have successfully completed the Beginners Class within the last 3 years. Due to the pandemic, Students will be permitted to enroll in Post Graduate I if they attended the Catherine E. Mills School of Ushering within the last 5 years and successfully completed the Beginners Class.

Objectives of Course

The objectives of this course are to strengthen and enhance the knowledge of each student who desires to further their studies in the silent method of Church Ushering. This course is designed for students that have successfully completed the First Year Beginners Class and would like more in-depth training. There will be more focus on building your knowledge of Church Ushering according to the National United Church Ushers Association of America, Inc. You will build upon your knowledge of Ushering in the Aisles, Ushering in the Balcony, Usher-in-Charge, Key Usher, Doorkeeper, and Ushering in a Time of Fire or other Emergencies. There will also be more focus on Collection of Offering, Ushering for Communion, and Performing a Ritualistic Service for a Deceased Usher. Finally, there will be training on "How to Serve for a Church Program vs. a Sermon."

Upon completion of this course (Post Graduate I), Students should be comfortable in demonstrating and illustrating each sign and signal used in the silent method of Church Ushering without hesitation. Additionally, students will know what signs are involved in each category of Ushering. He/she will be able to fully execute with accuracy all the signs and signals as they are related to the George T. Grier School of Ushering of the National United Church Ushers Association of America, Inc. Mandatory in-person floor training is an integral part of the Post Graduate I Class. This will give students hands-on floor experiences.

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month

What is Breast Cancer Awareness Month? Breast Cancer Awareness Month is an international health campaign that's held every October. The month aims to promote screening and prevention of the disease, which affects 2.3 million women worldwide. Known best for its pink theme color, the month features several campaigns and programs — conducted by groups ranging from breast cancer advocacy organizations to

local community organizations to major retailers — aimed at: supporting people diagnosed with breast cancer, including those with metastatic breast cancer educating people about breast cancer risk factors encouraging women to go for regular breast cancer screening starting at age 40 or earlier, depending on personal breast cancer risk fundraising for breast cancer research Within October, there are also specific dates designed to raise awareness of specific groups within the breast cancer community.

Metastatic Breast Cancer Awareness Day (October 13) October 13 is nationally recognized in the U.S. as Metastatic Breast Cancer Awareness Day. About 168,000 women in the U.S. are estimated to have metastatic breast cancer (cancer that spreads beyond the breast to other parts of the body). Researchers estimate that about 30% of early-stage breast cancers eventually metastasize. The day, which began in 2009, is meant to educate the public about the need for more money to go to the study of metastatic breast cancer and the development of new metastatic cancer treatments.

Men's Breast Cancer Awareness Week (October 17–23) Although breast cancer is much more common in women, breast cancer affects men, too. In 2021, President Joe Biden designated October 17 to October 23 Men's Breast Cancer Awareness Week. According to the American Cancer Society, 2,790 men in the U.S. will be diagnosed with breast cancer in 2024, and about 530 are expected to die from the disease. However, lack of awareness and stigma can be barriers to detection and care in men, trans men, and non-binary people.

The history of Breast Cancer Awareness Month The event began in 1985 as a week-long awareness campaign by the American Cancer Society, in partnership with Imperial Chemical Industries, a British company that made tamoxifen. The campaign eventually grew into a month-long event.

In 1992, the pink ribbon came into play after Alexandra Penney, SELF magazine's Editor-in-Chief, partnered with Evelyn Lauder, Estée Lauder's Senior Corporate Vice President, and a breast cancer survivor, to distribute pink ribbons after the magazine's second annual Breast Cancer Awareness Month issue.

Other variations of the pink ribbon have emerged in recent years to raise awareness that all people with breast cancer are not the same. These include ribbons for raising awareness about metastatic breast cancer, men with breast cancer, inflammatory breast cancer, and more.
